#### **SCHOOL STRUCTURE IN 2022**

## 2 Reporting Time

Please be reminded that all pupils are required to be in their classes by 7.25am so that the morning assembly can start promptly at 7.30am. The school will deploy staff members at school gates and the drop off point in school to conduct visual screening and manage flow of traffic and pupils.

#### 3 Dismissal Time

In our effort to ensure safety and smooth movement of pupils, we would like to remind parents and pupils on the following dismissal arrangement:

#### Primary 1

All P1 parents are allowed to enter the school through Gate F (opposite HDB block 896B) from 1.15 p.m. Pupils will be dismissed at the Basketball Court located at the Indoor Sports Hall. Pupils who are not fetched by their parents by 1.35 p.m. will be taken to the main foyer beside the General Office. Parents will have to enter the school through Gate B (main gate) to fetch their children if they are late.

#### Primary 2 to 6

All P2 to P6 pupils will be dismissed at the gate where they have made arrangements to be picked up, i.e. Gate A1, B and D. Parents can wait for their children opposite the respective gates in view of the Safe Management Measures (SMM) in place. We would like P2 (2022) parents to note that the P2 pupils will no longer be dismissed from the basketball court.

# 4 The school will stagger dismissal timings as indicated in the table below:

## 5 Recess and Meal Break Timing for Pupils

The school will continue with the practice of staggering recess for each level. This will help to minimise the crowd level in the canteen during recess time. Meal breaks have been introduced to allow pupils to have a short break before recess/dismissal. Pupils are encouraged to bring their own healthy snacks e.g. buns, fruits for consumption in class during the meal breaks.

# 6 Lunch Break for Pupils

The school has also factored a lunch break in the timetable for pupils involved in after school activities. The canteen vendors will continue to operate from 1.30 p.m. to 2.00 p.m. Pupils can have their lunch in the canteen before attending lessons/activities planned for them after curriculum hours.

#### 7 P5 and P6 Supplementary & Remedial Lessons

Supplementary lessons for the P6 level and remedial lessons for selected P5 pupils will be conducted on Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays from 2.00p.m. to 3.30p.m. Pupils who are identified for remedial and supplementary will be required to stay back in school in the afternoons for these lessons. More information will be disseminated via Parents Gateway.

#### 8 P5 and P6 Higher Mother Tongue Languages (HMT)

P5 & P6 HMT lessons will be held on Mondays from 2.00 p.m. to 4.00 p.m. These lessons are compulsory for pupils who have opted for Higher Mother Tongue in 2022.

## 9 P4 Remedial Lessons

P4 Remedial lessons for selected pupils who need additional support in their learning will start in Term 2. Should your child/ ward is required to attend remedial classes, information on the details will be disseminated via Parents Gateway closer to the start date.

#### SCHOOL ATTIRE

- Pupils are required to present themselves smartly at all times by tucking in their shirts when there are wearing their school uniforms. They are required to wear the prescribed full school uniform on the days they do not have PE lessons. On the days that they have PE lessons, pupils from the P1 and P2 levels can remain in their PE attire throughout the day while girls from the P3 to P6 levels have to put on their school skirts before and after their PE lessons.
- The school only allows girls to wear accessories that are black, white and maroon in colour. Girls are to refrain from wearing fanciful accessories to school.

## **GENERAL SAFETY AND SECURITY**


- 17 In our efforts to ensure the safety and security of our pupils, we would like to seek the cooperation of parents/guardians on the following measures:

- All visitors, including parents/guardians, are to report to the Security Guard Post at Gate B (main entrance) before proceeding to the General Office.
- Parents/Guardians are only allowed in the school premises if you:
  - a) need to fetch your child/ward home early due to valid reasons (before dismissal)
  - b) have an appointment with the school leaders or teachers
  - need to make an enquiry or process administrative matters at the General Office
- Parents/Guardians are discouraged from purchasing food/items from the canteen/bookshop for your child/ward. This is also to encourage pupils to learn to be independent and purchase these items themselves.
- Parents/Guardians are strongly discouraged from delivering your child's/ward's personal items (e.g. pocket money, books, stationery, food). Pupils should learn to remember to bring the necessary items to school.
- Parents/Guardians are strongly discouraged from preparing gifts packs or food items to give away during your child's/ward's birthday. This is because there are pupils who may be allergic to certain food items. Doing so may also result in other pupils feeling pressured to return similar favours in kind during their birthdays.

## TRAFFIC MANAGEMENT PLAN IN 2022

- 18 The safety and security of our pupils are our top priority. We have put in place measures to make sure that the school is safe and secure for our pupils.

# SAFE MANAGEMENT MEASURES (SMM) and HEALTH MATTERS

- 20 As the nation transits into Covid-19 Resilience Phase, the following SMM will be implemented in school:
  - Daily temperature taking exercise will be conducted every morning in class and in the
    afternoon if there are after school activities. Please ensure that your child/ward has a
    working oral digital thermometer (ODT) with him/her daily.
  - The school bookshop has stocked up its supplies on thermometers, battery replacement for thermometer and masks for ease of purchase by pupils. The pricing of the items can be found below.

- Pupils are required to put on their masks at all times, except during PE lessons. Ziploc bags can be used for safe keeping of masks during PE lessons.
- All pupils must bring along their own Trace Together Token every day. Please
  ensure that the token is in working order. Should the token require a replacement of
  batteries or is faulty, do get it replaced as soon as possible at Community Clubs/Centres,
  selected malls and also at various designated vending machines at HDB void decks. [For

- Pupils will perform wipe down routine at the start of the day, after meal break and at the end of each day.
- Pupils are reminded to practise safe distancing of 1m between individuals and groups during lessons and mealtimes.
- Under the following conditions detailed below, pupils should not report to school and parents should inform the school if your child/ward is:
  - tested positive for Covid-19
  - serving Stay Home Notice (SHN)
  - having fever or flu-like symptoms or issued with a Health Risk Warning (HRW)
- Safeguarding the health and well-being of our pupils is our collective responsibility. We seek your cooperation in bringing your child/ward to see a doctor should he/she develop flu-like symptoms. If you wish to send your child/ward to school while serving HRW, kindly ensure that a negative ART result is submitted daily to your child's/ward's form teacher before he/she reports to school.

## Covid-19 VACCINATION for 5 to 11 YEAR-OLD CHILDREN

21 MOE has recently sent detailed information via PG on the Covid-19 vaccination exercise for children aged 5 to 11 years old. The registration for vaccination will be done progressively and you will be notified via a customised SMS invitation to book a slot for your child's/ward's vaccination.

The school will excuse pupils for two weeks from strenuous physical activities after each vaccination dose. Pupils are reminded to inform their PE and relevant CCA teachers about the date of their vaccination so that they will be exempted from strenuous physical activities for two weeks. Similarly, the PE and relevant CCA teachers will also check in with pupils before the start of activities if they had done their vaccination recently.

#### STUDENT PROTECTION PLAN 2021

The school has provided a Student Protection Plan, under NTUC Income Insurance Cooperative Ltd to insure your child/ward against accidents related to school activities, CCAs, sports as well as travelling to and from school.
